



Synopsis of CCSU Data in CSU Board of Trustees Enrollment Report

October 28, 2009

This document provides a synopsis of information about Central Connecticut State University that will appear in the fall 2009 CSU System Enrollment Report to be delivered to the Board of Trustees in the November 2009.

The CSU System Fall 2009 Enrollment Report

Fall 2009 represents the first year when this report has been prepared by the System Office rather than by individual campuses. To prepare the report, the System Office requested a common set of information from the four campuses about fall 2009 enrollment, fall 2009 undergraduate admissions, four-year and six-year graduation rates of the full-time, first-time undergraduate cohort entering in fall 2003, retention rates of the full-time, first-time cohort entering in fall 2008, and completions in 2008-09. These data were submitted by the CCSU Office of Institutional Research and Assessment by the deadline of Oct. 23, 2009. The report to the Board prepared by the System Office will focus on system-level trends and institutional comparisons primarily related to fall 2009 or most recent available data. Each campus supplied some narrative material summarizing sections in the report following a broad outline provided by the System Office.

Highlights

- Overall enrollment is up 1.9% (headcount) and 2.0% (FTE) over fall 2008.
 - Undergraduate headcount enrollment grew 0.8% over fall 2008.
 - Graduate headcount enrollment ended a multi-year slide, growing 6.2% over fall 2008 but still 9.0% below fall 2004 levels.
- Minority students accounted for 17.2% of the student population in fall 2009, up from 16.6% in fall 2008 and 15.2% in fall 2004.
- The one-year retention rate of full-time, first-time students entering in fall 2008 was 79% and has remained stable over the past four years.
- The six-year graduation rate of full-time, first-time students increased to 49% for the cohort entering CCSU in fall 2003 from 46% for the cohort entering CCSU in fall 2002 and from 40% from the cohort entering in fall 2000.
- CCSU awarded 1,660 bachelor's degrees in 2008-09, the largest number since at least the late 1980s.

1. Narrative Summary

OVERVIEW

The number of enrolled full-time undergraduate and graduate students at Central reached a three decade high of 8,423 in fall 2009, and overall enrollment is up about 2% over fall 2008. The proportion of enrolled students from minority race/ethnicity backgrounds has increased to 17.2% in fall 2009, up from 16.6% in fall 2008 and 15.2% in fall 2004. CCSU awarded 1,660 bachelor's degrees 2008-09, the largest number since at least the 1980s, and six-year graduation rates of full-time, first-time students rose to 49%, the highest number on record.

STUDENT CHARACTERISTICS- Undergraduate, Graduate Profile, Retention & Graduation Rates

Overall headcount enrollment rose from 12,233 in fall 2008, to 12,461 for fall 2009 an increase of 228 students or 1.9%. Full-time equivalent (FTE) enrollment also grew from 9,429 in 2008 to 9,619 for fall 2009, a one-year increase of 2.0% and a 6.9% increase since fall 2004. Enrollment of full-time students reached a three-decade high of 8,423. In fall 2009, 2,351 more full-time students enrolled when compared to the fall 1997 enrollment of 6,072 full-time students; this represents an increase of 38.7%. Headcount enrollment of part-time students rebounded slightly, from 3,942 in fall 2008 to 4,038 in fall 2009, a one-year increase of 2.4%, but enrollment of this population is still down 11.1% since fall 2004.

The number of students from Connecticut increased from 11,548 in fall 2004 to 11,806 in fall 2009, with almost all of this increase occurring in the last year; the number of out-of-state students decreased from a recent high of 541 in fall 2007 to 469 in fall 2009; and the number of international students decreased from a recent high of 275 in fall 2004 to 193 in fall 2009.

The number of minority students (Black, Non-Hispanic; American Indian or Alaskan Native; Asian or Pacific Islander; and Hispanic) has increased from 1,876 in fall 2004 when these students represented 15.2% of the student population to 2,146 in fall 2009 when they represented 17.2% of all students.

Overall undergraduate enrollment continued to increase. Full-time undergraduate enrollment of 7,859 in fall 2009 is at its highest level since 1975, when 8,021 undergraduate students were enrolled full-time. Undergraduate headcount enrollment has decreased from 2,359 in fall 2004 to 2,130 in fall 2009, a decline of 9.7%, although about three quarters of this decrease results from lower enrollment among non-matriculated (non-degree) students.

Overall graduate enrollment rebounded from a recent low of 2,327 in fall 2008 to 2,472 in fall 2009, an increase of 6.2% that ends a six-year decline from a high of 2,848 in fall 2002. A total of 564 graduate students were enrolled full-time, the highest number ever, and 5% higher than the most recent peak of 536 in fall 2006. A decrease in non-matriculated (non-degree seeking) graduate students accounts for the bulk of long-term decline in graduate student enrollment, with enrollment of non-matriculated graduate students down from 742 in fall 2001 to just 322 in fall 2009. The number of matriculated (degree-seeking) graduate students is actually up slightly from 2,075 in fall 2001 to 2,150 in fall 2009.

Six-year graduation rates of full-time, first-time degree-seeking undergraduates increased to 49% for full-time, first-time undergraduate students who entered in fall 2003, the highest level on record. Over a five-year period, these rates increased 4 percentage points for white students, but ten percentage points for Hispanic students and eight percentage points for Black, Non-Hispanic students. One-year retention rates have remained stable over the past three years at 79%.

UNDERGRADUATE APPLICATIONS & ADMISSIONS

New undergraduate student applications have increased from 6,985 in fall 2004 to 8,898 in fall 2009, an increase of 27.4%. This increase has been driven primarily by applications among prospective first-time students, with 6,792 applications in fall 2009, a 30.7% increase over fall 2004. The number of overall admissions increased from 4,526 in fall 2004 to 5,188 in fall 2009, an increase of 14.6%. Among prospective first-time students, 3,160 were offered admission in fall 2004, compared to 3,697, an increase of 17.0%. Institution of a waiting list for admission in fall 2009 and a declining yield rate of admissions to enrollments limited the entering class of full-time first-time students in fall 2009 to 1,281, a slight decline from fall 2008, when 1,303 enrolled and about the same level as fall 2004, when 1,284 enrolled.

1. Narrative Summary

A total of 2,106 applications were received from prospective transfer students in fall 2009, an increase of 17.8% over fall 2004. Forty-one percent or 898 of these applications were from students most recently attending one of Connecticut's twelve community colleges. Applicants from Connecticut's community colleges increased 10.3% since fall 2004, a slower rate than other transfer students and the rate of first-time student applications. A total of 452 of these students enrolled in fall 2009, with the most students originating from Tunxis (131), Manchester (111), and Middlesex (49) Community Colleges.

DEGREES & AWARDS

In 2008-09, 2,334 degrees and certificates were awarded, a 7.7% increase since 2003-04. This total represents 1,660 bachelor's degrees, 62 post-baccalaureate certificates, 522 master's degrees, 80 post-master's certificates, and 10 doctoral degrees. The 1,660 bachelor's degrees awarded represent the largest number since at least 1988-89, and an increase of 16.9% over the 1,420 bachelor's degrees awarded in 2003-04. In 2008-09, the largest number of these degrees, 471 or 28.3%, were awarded in business fields; 354 or 21.3% were awarded in psychology and social sciences; 351 or 21.1% were awarded in humanities, arts, and communication fields; 188 or 11.3% were awarded in science, engineering, and technology fields; 183 or 11.0% were in education fields (secondary education awards are included in their respective disciplinary fields, not education); 81 or 4.9% were awarded in health and life sciences; 20 or 1.2% were awarded in social and public services; and 12 or 0.7% were awarded in liberal or multidisciplinary studies.

The number of graduate awards (including degrees and certificates) has declined 9.8% from a recent high of 780 in 2005-06, reflecting the decline in graduate student enrollment. In 2008-09, the largest number of these awards, 416 or 61.7%, were conferred in education fields; 76 or 11.2% were conferred in science, engineering, and technology fields; another 76 or 11.2% were conferred in health and life sciences; 39 or 5.8% were conferred in humanities, arts, and communication fields; 36 or 5.3% were conferred in business; 17 or 2.5% were conferred in social sciences and psychology; 9 or 1.3% were conferred in social and public services; and 5 or 0.7% were conferred in liberal or multidisciplinary studies.
