Dear Professor Perreault:

As the school year draws to an end we are again asking for your assistance in identifying potential student-mentees for Professional Women in Construction's ("PWC") Mentor Program. Enclosed please find a flyer regarding this year's program. Please make colored copies and distribute the flyers to the students or hang them as you see fit so that the students have access to them. We have listed you as the person that the students should contact if they have questions about the program and/or are interested in becoming a student-mentee.

PWC is looking for students enrolled in the construction related fields of study: architecture, engineering and construction management, to be matched with one PWC mentor for the mentor program. If the student from this year would like to participate in the program again starting September 2012, we encourage that. Because you and your colleagues have the most familiarity and interaction with the students, we ask that you approach the students who you believe will be interested in being a student-mentee for this year's program. We are happy to advise that so far this year two of our student-mentees have obtained jobs in the construction industry in Connecticut due to their involvement with the PWC Mentor Program.

The student-mentees that you select will be invited to attend four PWC dinner meetings free of charge at a location in central Connecticut. The PWC meetings that the chosen student-mentee will attend are scheduled for the months of September, December, February and April, usually on the first Tuesday of the month. The student-mentee will shadow for that evening a PWC mentor who is employed in the professional field of the student's interest. Additionally, we encourage the PWC mentor to invite the student for a site visit to an ongoing project or to his/her office. Please note that the student-mentee must have his or her own transportation to the PWC dinner meetings at a location in central Connecticut.

The first PWC event for the 2011-2012 calendar year is expected to be scheduled for September 18, 2012. We ask that you provide us with the name of the selected student-mentees, as well as their field of study as soon as possible but no later than September 5, 2012 so that we have time to match that student with the appropriate PWC mentor. Also, we ask that you provide us with the student-mentee's contact information.
