\*The Police Academy credits accepted at CCSU are based on recommendations from the Connecticut Credit Assessment Program (CCAP) (see <https://www.charteroak.edu/prior-learning-assessment/law-public-safety-ccap-trng-credit.php>).

Police Academy credits can be applied to lower-division courses (CRM 1XX/2XX) and unrestricted electives.

Detective Certificate courses can be applied to upper-division courses (CRM 3XX) and unrestricted electives.

**NOTE: Students still need to complete all University Requirements including:**

- **General Education courses**
- **Major requirements (at least 15 credits must be taken at CCSU)**
- **Minor requirements (at least 9 credits must be taken at CCSU)**
- **A total of 120 total credits (at least 30 credits must be taken at CCSU)**
