With 25,000 students, of which about 18% are international, the University of Freiburg is one of the larger universities in the BW-CT exchange program. Students can choose from 300 degree programs across 11 departments with a wide variety of courses offered in English. Freiburg is known as the "sunniest city in Germany" and students enjoy outdoor activities throughout the year.

### **Heidelberg University**

Founded in 1386, Heidelberg University is Germany's oldest university, with almost 30,000 students of which 5,000 are international. Exchange students can choose from a number of classes taught in English in a variety of disciplines. The university also offers a wealth of German language and literature courses.

## **University of Hohenheim**

Founded in 1818 after devastating famines, the University of Hohenheim is engaged in intensive basic research and has traditionally been committed to developing innovative solutions for society's pressing problems. Today, the university is one of the world's leading universities in the field of agricultural and food sciences which, together with the natural, economic, and social sciences, creates a unique profile. # Karlsruhe Institute of Technology

Karlsruhe Institute of Technology (KIT) is particularly strong in the natural sciences and engineering. Students benefit from the close connection between research and teaching. KIT offers accommodation, free German language courses, and professional assistance in every KIT department.

## **University of Konstanz**

At the University of Konstanz, scenically located between Lake Constance and the Alps, students will study as one of 11,000 students from 90 different countries. They can select from a variety of English-taught courses, and have the possibility to participate in the intensive four-week German language course, GO Konstanz, which also helps them to master the infamous German bureaucracy.

# **University of Mannheim**

The University of Mannheim is one of Germany's leading universities with a business orientation and is known for its international and interdisciplinary approach. One in eight students is international. The university ranks high for research and is renowned for its economics and social sciences. Students can also take classes in the humanities, law, mathematics, and computer science.

#### **Mannheim University of Music and Performing Arts**

The Mannheim University of Music and Performing Arts is the second largest institution of its kind in Baden-Württemberg. Among the majors taught are: orchestral instruments, keyboard instruments, voice (concert and opera), and conducting (orchestra and choir). The high quality of education and training is demonstrated by international prizes secured in competitions and leading positions in renowned orchestras held by graduates.

#### **University of Stuttgart**

The University of Stuttgart is situated in a highly dynamic economic region, famous for its cutting-edge technology, information technology, engineering, energy research, and digital humanities. Spread out over two locations, its outstanding position as a research university and the wide range of its subject areas make it an internationally recognized and future-oriented center for science and research.

## **University of Tübingen**

Founded in 1477, the University of Tübingen may be one of the most traditional institutions in Germany, but prides itself in cutting-edge research at Europe's largest Artificial Intelligence center. Many classes are taught in English and international students profit from a buddy program, numerous excursions, and an extensive offering of courses in their excellent German as a Foreign Language Department.

#### **University of Ulm**

The University of Ulm offers a large selection of English-taught courses in the natural sciences, engineering, computer science, and mathematics. International students arrive prior to the start of the semester to learn German in an intensive language course, while getting to know everyday life at the university with its wide range of sports facilities and diverse university groups.
