A COMPLETE APPLICATION INCLUDES

Applying to the Professional Program is done through an online platform called **Student Learning and** Licensure (SL&L). Pre-Education students are emailed periodically during the year from the Assistant Dean in the School of Education with step-by-step instructions on how to apply to the professional program along with the application link specific each student's certification program. There is NO COST to *apply* to the professional program.

Upon acceptance to the professional program, students will be required to purchase a subscription to Student Learning & Licensure. There is a one-time fee of \$139 plus tax. Students will use SL&L in all professional program coursework and will also use the platform to apply for student teaching.
