



Campus Hazing Transparency Report

FEDERAL STATE AND ANTI-HAZING LAWS

[The Stop Campus Hazing Act \(SCHA\)](#) is federal legislation that became law in December 2024. It requires each institute of higher education to disclose hazing incidents. [Connecticut Anti-Hazing Law](#) defines hazing as, “any action which recklessly or intentionally endangers the health or safety of a person for the purpose of initiation, admission into or affiliation with, or as a condition for continued membership in a student organization.”

CENTRAL CONNECTICUT STATE UNIVERSITY HAZING POLICY AND PROCEDURE

HAZING PREVENTION AND AWARENESS PROGRAMS

The university provides hazing prevention training to all club and organization leaders, as well as with all student-athletes. This training is designed to bring awareness to hazing with the goal of preventing hazing behaviors. Student club and organization leaders participate in training that discusses the definition of hazing and makes clear that hazing is prohibited in all university clubs and organizations. They also participate in the university’s bystander intervention training, which teaches participants to identify hazing behaviors, understand that hazing is a problem, recognize their responsibility to intervene, and take action by reporting such behaviors.

Throughout the Fall 2025 semester, there were three club and organization leader trainings that discussed hazing; these took place on September 4, 2025, September 8, 2025, and October 23, 2025. In addition, leaders and members of new clubs engaged in a training on December 5, 2025 that discussed the topic of hazing and how to avoid hazing behaviors in their clubs and organizations. Hazing was also addressed during the opening year meeting with all student-athletes. In addition, Central’s Inter-Greek Council hosted a “Stop Hazing” campaign from September 23-25, 2025. This was a digital program that provided information and resources to students about hazing and how to prevent its occurrence.

REPORTING PROCESS

Central Connecticut State University encourages the reporting of incidents of hazing and takes each report seriously. The university diligently and thoroughly investigates all reports, in accordance with the *CSCU Hazing Prevention and Reporting Policy* and the *CSCU Interim Student Code of Conduct*. Any person may report an incident of hazing in person, by mail, by telephone, or by email, using the contact information listed for the university’s Office of Student Rights and Responsibilities or by utilizing Central Connecticut State University’s reporting electronic system, https://ccsu-advocate.symplicity.com/public_report/index.php/pid797764.

REPORTS OF HAZING

Per the SCHA, Central Connecticut State University compiles and publishes relevant and pertinent information¹ regarding each incident of hazing for which a recognized student organization was found responsible.

Beginning July 1, 2025, this information is collected and subsequently published (and updated) twice a year².

As indicated below, there were no reports of hazing reported to the university during this reporting period.
