




Topic Sentences: Guiding & Organizing



A topic sentence is the first sentence in a paragraph that introduces the main idea or point of its section. It functions as a roadmap for the reader, telling them what to expect in the rest of the paragraph. Every body paragraph in an essay should begin with a topic sentence that clearly ties back to the thesis statement to ensure that the paragraph contributes to the overall argument.
