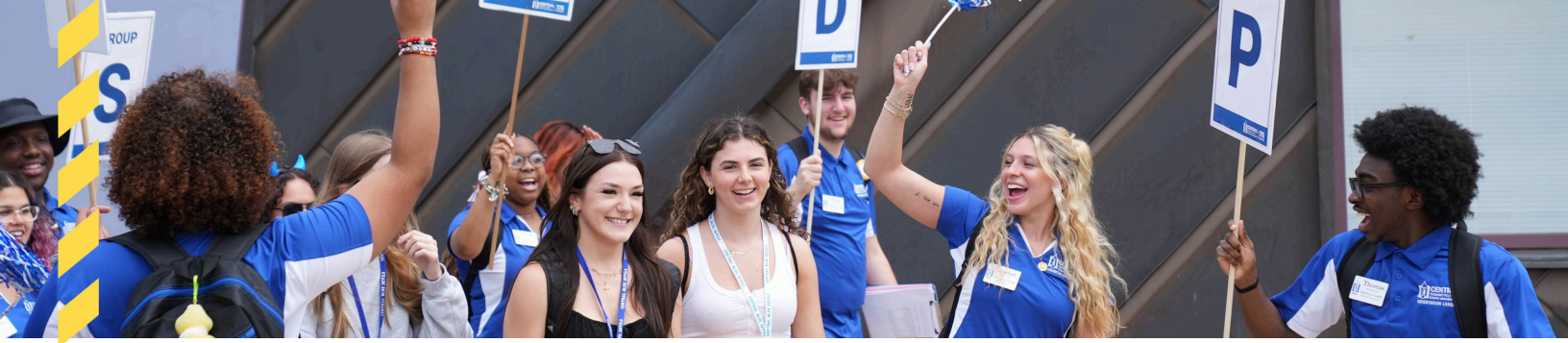

## New Student Orientation

I invite you to join us for New Student Orientation this summer! Our two-day, overnight Orientation program is a high-impact program designed to help create a sense of belonging and connection to the campus and to other students, while also setting the students up for academic success. Students will interact with various support services and resources on campus, and will also work alongside our academic advisors to finalize their Fall 2026 Academic Course Schedule.

**\*Shortly after confirmation, new students receive an email titled, "Sign up for Central Orientation", which includes a link to sign up for Orientation. Please encourage your students to sign up today, as spots fill quickly.**

## New Student Checklist:

# ACADEMIC PREPARATION

## Student Transition & Registration Tool (START)

New first-year students can now share their Fall 2026 course preferences with Academic Advisors.

Please remind your student to check their Central email for a message titled, "It's Time to START Planning your Fall 2026 academic schedule!". This email contains a link to their START., which is a form where they will be asked to share academic preferences, scores and credits achieved before college. In this form, they will also be able to identify if they need to take any placement exams- and schedule said exams!

**\*Note\*** The sooner a student completes their START., the sooner advisors will begin to create their Fall 2026 Academic Schedule. This ensures better access to courses! Don't wait!

## Academic Course Schedule for Fall 2026!

- As mentioned above, completing the START form and scheduling math & writing placement exams is a critical piece of the advisor process when building Fall academic schedules for incoming students.

- At Summer Orientation, advisors will meet with students to review their Fall 2026 schedule. At this point, they will also select their First Year Experience (FYE) Course and make any necessary edits to their schedule.
