We hope to set aside some funds for innovation. We need to support good new ideas. One practice that is being more and more widely practiced and I'd like to see receive deeper investigation from the CCSU community is flipped classrooms. A discussion ensues about retention and graduation. The Provost urges faculty to report mid-term grades so the the Early Intervention Program can do what it's designed to do, if necessary. He will represent CCSU at the Academic and Student Affairs meeting of the BOR
