- 6)Budget update Larry Wilder

a.General budget update: Wilder talked up the 10% reduction and how it would affect us as an university and the process in which it came to be. The tuition and fee freeze was brought to the board and they are presuming that it will be passed. b. Status of CCSU budget proposals reviewed by President Miller: inviting the President to the next two meetings to see what he has to say about the proposals c. Impact of Governor's "Plan B" budget proposal / additional 10% agency cuts governor: 10% (\$500,000-\$600,000; with no fringes included) of services that we don't see and now there is an additional 10% reduction (\$4.3Million Without Fringes) that does come from the budget that is being distributed. There will be some kind of reduction. In line with the 15% budget cut so far. d. Status of one-time funds and release of 2020 bond funds: The governor is quoted that there is need for capital projects; \$94 million to be distributed in 2012.
