

Microsoft Authenticator App Update



On Monday March 13, 2023 the Microsoft Authenticator app will be updated to use number matching in place of the approve/deny pop-up for access to your Office 365 account. With number matching, the Microsoft Authenticator app requires you to type a number displayed on the screen to complete the authentication process. This the feature helps to prevent an accidental approval to access your Office 365 account and provides protection against malicious attacks against your account. This update will not impact those who use a phone call or text message to access your Office 365 account instead of the Microsoft Authenticator app.



Cylance Anti-Virus for Home to be Discontinued

During the COVID pandemic, IT purchased licensing to Cylance Anti-Virus for home/personal use due to the number of people using personal equipment. The COVID funds used to purchase this level of licensing have expired, therefore ending our ability to offer it after June 1st. If you have Cylance installed on your personally-owned computer, it may continue to work but will no longer receive updates after this date.

Operating System (OS) Versions

We are in the process of testing Windows 11 and Apple macOS Ventura. We anticipate upgrading most classrooms to the new versions of the respective OS this summer.

We are asking that you refrain from updating the OS on your CCSU-owned equipment in your offices until we have completed testing. If you update and run into problems, our only current solution will be to reimage your computer back to a supported operating system.

Security Awareness Training

Security awareness training is being coordinated by the System Office using "KnowBe4", which is an online security awareness training program. This training will be made available in February/March.
