Historical Note


Both the instructors and students of mathematics recognized the need for a national mathematics society, which would appeal essentially to the undergraduate. Dr. Emily Kathryn Wyant is considered the founder of Kappa Mu Epsilon, which was organized to fill this need. In the fall of 1930, Dr. Wyant was at Northeastern Oklahoma State Teachers College at Tahlequah, as a professor of mathematics. She went to work with vigor and enthusiasm to transform the mathematics club there, which had been in existence since 1927, into the first chapter of a national honor society. Her colleague L.P. Woods was largely responsible for the completed rituals used for the initiation of members and installation of officers.
