

Technology Requirements for Online Learning



1. Internet Connection

Make sure it is good enough internet that connection does not get lost during video conferencing and that you can access course materials like videos.

2. Reliable Computer

A laptop or desktop computer is recommended, but other devices can be acceptable as well. Make sure your device allows you to connect to the internet, participate in video conferencing, type papers, complete projects, and access websites and materials for your classes.



3. Web Cam, Speakers and Microphone

Many of your classes may require you to participate in video conferencing via Teams, Webex, or Blackboard Collaborate. This allows your classmates and professor to see and hear your input. In order to get the full benefit of attending class like this, make sure your device has a working web cam, speakers, and microphone.

4. Supported Browsers on Your Device

Different features of Blackboard may require you to have access to different browsers or operating systems. For example, to use Proctorio to proctor a test for you, Google Chrome is needed.
